The winner of the second Corporate Citizenship Award for the small to medium enterprise category is considered by many to be one of the pioneers in the EMR industry in Canada.

CLINICARE was one of the first in the Physician Office marketplace to participate in the mainstream Health Informatics field by participating in COACH conferences and subsequent eHealth Conferences by exhibiting and through professional contributions to educational sessions. The Company's CEO, Dennis Niebergal for many years co-chaired "The Great Debate", a traditional highlight of eHealth conferences to this day.

Internationally recognized as experts in the Electronic Medical Records and Public Key infrastructure technologies, CLINICARE has supported many of its physician users in publishing peer review articles, and providing them with the opportunity to educate their colleagues on a diversity of healthcare IT

topics. Their participation in industry ranges from sponsorship commitments to committee involvement.

The company has actively participated in various national organizations, with representatives serving on the Boards of Directors of both COACH and CHITTA, and taking other high profile leadership positions. Currently, CLINICARE is one of only two vendors represented on the Canadian Electronic Drug (CeRx) Messaging Standard Project Working Group, an Infoway-led standards development initiative.
